Registration Procedures

Register for Term 1 today!

IST's School Year is separated into three academic terms. The terms for the 2021-22 School Year are:

Term 1: August 18 - November 19 Term 2: November 29 - March 10 Term 3: March 21 - May 27

Registration is now open for Term 1. There will be future registrations for Terms 2 and 3.

Please note that certain offerings like our Trailblazer Soccer Team and Challenge Robotics require a multi-term commitment. You will register for each Term separately, but by registering in Term 1, you are making a commitment to the team for the entire commitment period. Check the offering description for details.

Terms: 1, 2, and 3 Days: Tuesday & Thursday Time: 3:45 - 5 PM Cost: \$500 per term; \$150 one-time materials fee

Have you always wanted to be a rock star? Then join the Middle School Rock Band!

Rock Band is open to vocalists, guitarists, bassists, drummers, violinists, and keyboardists who want to experience what it's like to be in a rock 'n roll band. Aside from being fun and genuinely cool, being in a band develops many musical aspects that are specific to teamwork, including listening skills, taking musical direction, accountability, and being open-minded about others' tastes in music.

From a musical standpoint, students will learn about pop songs' structure, in general. Intros, verses, choruses, hooks, riffs, learning to solo, outros, and interludes will be taught. Students will enjoy learning to play current and past rock and pop hits! Our Rock Band club experience will culminate in the group recording their own version of a rock song and we will also have performances throughout the year!



- Previous soccer experience is required for player safety.
- Registration for Trailblazer Soccer requires a commitment for the entire school year, Terms 1-3.

IST is excited to be partnering with Lake Travis Elite Soccer to provide the long-anticipated return of our IST Trailblazer Soccer teams! Lake Travis Elite will be providing training and coaching to prepare our Trailblazers for the highly competitive Austin Private School Association season in the Spring.

Players will work to develop their individual skills while coming together as a team. While previous soccer experience is required for the safety of all team members, we are also looking for attendance, dedication, and hard work!

Please note that for APSA league games, coaches may prioritize playing time for players that are able to compete safely and competitively, given the physical size and ability of our competition.

We are finalizing the details, but practices are likely to be held at Field of Dreams, located on Highway 71 in Bee Cave. While each student is responsible for their own transportation, we will work together to arrange a carpool to maximize convenience.



We will be offering two teams: a Junior Team (grades 4-6) and a Senior Team (grades 5-8). Players will be placed in teams at the coach's discretion, so there may be students from these grades on either team. Younger students may be eligible depending on the individual player's experience and skills. Both teams will practice together.

Pickup Time & Procedures

Students must be picked up promptly at 5:00 PM.

While we understand that life and traffic are often unpredictable, we request that parents pick up their children promptly at 5 PM. If punctual pick-up is a recurring problem, IST reserves the right to charge an additional fee that would not exceed \$5 per minute/per child and would be billed through TADS.

Parents and/or guardians are required to check out each student daily by walking into the School Building and signing out their child with the assigned after-school teacher/club advisor. Students are only allowed to leave IST premises with pre-authorized individuals, and may not leave unattended.

Children will not be released to anyone other than a parent, guardian, or person listed on the child's authorization form on file with IST. If you need to make a change to who is authorized to pick up your child, please notify the Front Desk (frontdesk@istexas.org) in writing or via email prior to pick-up time. If a staff member is unfamiliar with any person picking up a child, IST will require photo identification prior to release.

Snacks

All students should bring a healthy snack each day.
